Record of Decision Transit and Transportation System Management (TSM) Components

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The I-95 New Haven Harbor Crossing (NHHC) Corridor Improvement Program is one of Connecticut's largest multi-modal transportation improvement initiatives. The program includes operational, safety and capacity improvements to over 7 miles of Interstate 95, including a new signature bridge over New Haven Harbor. In addition to new and upgraded Shore Line East commuter rail stations, there are numerous Transit and Transportation System Management (TSM) components included as part of the program.

This report summarizes the current status of the implementation of the Transit and TSM components.

The August, 1999 report entitled: <u>Federal Highway Administration Record of Decision for Interstate 95 New Haven Harbor Crossing Pearl Harbor Memorial Bridge (Q-Bridge)</u>, commonly known as the "ROD", documents the Transit and TSM components in Section 1.2 (pp. 3-4). The components are as follows:





ROD Requirement: Shore Line East

Continue to provide Shore Line East rail passenger service between New Haven and New London. Service levels in operation at the time of the start of construction will be continued. Ridership and service frequencies will be monitored regularly to determine the need for service modifications.












ROD Transit and Transportation System Management (TSM) Requirements July 2003 – December 2003

ROD Requirement: Bus Service

Continue to provide bus service between Branford and New Haven via the Tomlinson (Route 1) Bridge at service levels in operation at the time of the start of construction. This will include service on Connecticut Transit Routes F & G. Ridership and service frequencies will be monitored regularly to determine the need for service modifications.










ROD Transit and Transportation System Management (TSM) Requirements July 2003 – December 2003

ROD Requirement: Commuter Rail Station at State Street

Construct a new commuter rail passenger station stop on State Street, between Court and Chapel Streets in New Haven. This station will serve rail commuters who desire more direct access to downtown New Haven. The new State Street station stop would be in addition to stops currently served by the Shore Line East commuter rail service (New Haven to New London).







ROD Requirement: Optimized Flextime


Employers in the region will be approached by ConnDOT or its representative (e.g., rideshare brokerage firm) with a marketing information program about the employer voluntarily providing flextime work schedules. Ongoing or periodic reviews and surveys will be made to ascertain the level of participation; adjustments to the program will be made to concentrate on the most productive types of employees.

ROD Requirement: Voluntary Rideshare (HOV) Preferential Parking

Employers in the region will be approached by ConnDOT or its representative (e.g., rideshare brokerage firm) with a marketing information program about the employer voluntarily providing preferential parking for rideshare (HOV) participants. Ongoing or periodic reviews* and surveys will be made to ascertain the level of participation; adjustments to the program will be made to concentrate on the most productive types of employees. (*Periodic review is understood to mean general promotion of Ridesharing alternatives as well as secondary promotion of preferential parking programs.)

ROD Requirement: Guaranteed Ride Home

Employers in the region will be approached by ConnDOT or its representative (e.g., rideshare brokerage) to set up a program in which the employer would voluntarily provide for documented rideshare (HOV/transit) riders taxi or equivalent service to the home from the workplace in the event of certain unusual or emergency conditions comprising up to one percent of workdays.







ROD Requirement: Insurance Breaks (\$40) for Rideshare (HOV)/Transit

All insurance providers serving the region will be approached by ConnDOT or its representative to set up a program in which the insurance company would voluntarily provide an annual rebate to auto insurance policy holders who could document regular transit or HOV use.

Additional Travel Lane to Open on I-95 Northbound from Lake Saltonstall Bridge to Exit 54 on November 25, 2003

Drivers traveling along I-95 Northbound in Branford can now look forward to an additional travel lane. On November 25, 2003 a third lane will open on I-95 northbound from the Lake Saltonstall Bridge to Exit 54 (Cedar Street). The opening of the additional lane marks the first of a series of highway improvements which are part of the I-95 New Haven Harbor Crossing (NHHC) Corridor Improvement Program. Along with this additional lane, wider shoulders were constructed on both sides of the roadway to enhance safety.

The I-95 NHHC Corridor Improvement Program includes roadway and transit improvements designed to reduce congestion and improve traffic flow and mobility along the highly-traveled I-95 corridor between New Haven and Branford. This important milestone is part of Contract D, which began in June 2002 and is part of the second phase of the Program. The first phase featured the addition of a Shore Line East commuter rail station at State Street, downtown New Haven, which opened June 7, 2002.

Other highlights of Contract D, which encompasses the reconstruction of I-95 between the Lake Saltonstall Bridge and Exit 54 in Branford, include the following:

- Construction of a third travel lane in each direction, along with wider shoulders and new median barriers on I-95;
- Replacement of the Todds Hill Road Bridge over I-95;
- Rehabilitation of the Cherry Hill Road Bridge over I-95;
- Widening of I-95 over the southbound on-ramp at Exit 53 (Branford Connector);
- Installation of new signage and lighting;
- An upgraded drainage system;
- Construction of noise barrier walls along I-95 at Exit 54 and Todds Hill and Cherry Hill roads;
- Relocation to Exit 55 (across from Regal Cinemas) of the Exit 54 commuter parking lot, which opened October 18, 2002;
- Widening of Cedar Street to accommodate turning lanes;
- Reconfiguration of ramps and resurfacing at both service areas on I-95 in Branford.

Substantial completion of Contract D is expected by late this fall, with construction completion anticipated in the spring of 2004.

As an integral part of the Program, the Department of Transportation has taken considerable efforts to implement a plan to maintain traffic flow during those hours when commuters and other travelers are most likely to be driving through the construction area. These peak travel times include both morning and evening rush hours. The number of lanes available on I-95 has not and will not be reduced during these peak hours, which are defined as 6:00 am to 9:00 am in the morning and 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm in the evening.

No Lane Closures During Thanksgiving Weekend on I-95 Between New Haven and Branford

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (ConnDOT) is announcing that no lane closures related to construction activity will occur on I-95 Northbound and I-95 Southbound between the East Haven/New Haven town line and Exit 54 – Cedar Street in Branford beginning Wednesday morning, November 26 at 6:00a.m. through Monday night, December 1 at 8:00p.m. To facilitate traffic flow on I-95 during the Thanksgiving holiday, work on Contract D and Contract C1 of the I-95 New Haven Harbor Crossing Corridor Improvement Program will not include lane closures.

Substantial completion of Contract D (I-95 between Exit 51 and Exit 54 in Branford) is expected by late this fall, with the remainder of construction scheduled to be completed by Spring 2004. Contract C1 (between the eastern end of the Lake Saltonstall Bridge and the New Haven/East Haven town line) is scheduled to be completed by November 2005.
